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WESTERN SYDNEY JOBS HUB A STEP CLOSER

The largest NSW Government office hub in the State is a step closer with the ‘topping out’ of Walker Corporation’s \$2 billion development at 4 Parramatta Square.

Minister for Water, Property and Housing, Melinda Pavey said the 65,000sqm development will accommodate more than 5,000 public servants when it opens in late 2019.

“Of these 5,000 roles, 1,600 will relocate from Sydney’s CBD to 4 Parramatta Square, marking a major milestone in the Government’s Decade of Decentralisation policy,” Mrs Pavey said.

“We’ve now relocated more than 3,500 full time roles from Sydney’s CBD to Western Sydney since 2011, delivering more jobs closer to where people live.”

Member for Parramatta Geoff Lee said the new hub at 4 Parramatta Square marks a new era in government workspaces.

“The older government workspaces are now to be replaced by contemporary, flexible office hubs which will improve cross-agency collaboration, break down silos and promote greater efficiency in the public sector.”

4 Parramatta Square will be occupied by staff from the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment, and the Department of Customer Service.

The development boasts green credentials, including 5 Star NABERS Energy, 4 Star NABERS Water and a 5 Star Greenstar rating.

Completion of 4 Parramatta Square is expected by November 2019, with the first staff moving in soon after.

Parramatta Square will be a vibrant, three-hectare mixed-use precinct, located at the centre of Parramatta’s CBD, within easy walking distance to the city’s parks, recreation and retail facilities.

Earlier this year the NSW Government announced it would further expand its foothold in Parramatta, with a further 4,200 office workers scheduled to move into the neighbouring 6 Parramatta Square from late 2021.

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
